<b>Problem Statement</b>	The Gambia suffers from weak governance characterized by a low level of transparency and accountability, weak enforcement of laws and inefficient delivery of services. There are low levels of civic awareness and popular participation while individuals and groups do not effectively utilize accountability mechanisms to ensure adherence to the rule of law, protection rights or demand goods and services. Consequently, public institutions and officials are not compelled to perform and deliver according to law.				
<b>Theory of Change</b>	With these program areas, the expected vision of success is: Active, highly aware and empowered citizenry who are utilizing accountability mechanisms to hold State institutions and agents accountable.				
<b>Objectives</b>	To ensure that no one is denied fundamental freedoms but that everyone enjoys freedom without fear of reprisals in any form.	To ensure that no one is excluded from participation, opportunities and services on account of one's sex, ethnicity, religion, disability or other status but to be effectively included and participate.	To ensure that no one is unaware of their rights and duties but that everyone is well informed and well empowered to become an agency for change.	To ensure that no one denied access to information but that there is open governance system with citizens able to access and understand laws, processes, institutions, decisions and services.	To ensure that there is no abuse of power and impunity within the state and society, but that institutions and officials adhere to the rule of law and take responsibility for their decisions and actions.
<b>Scope</b>	This program area will focus on the promotion of fundamental human rights and freedoms necessary to ensure and open civic space, democratic governance and sustainable development.	This program area focuses on addressing structural issues that give rise to discrimination, exclusion and denial of the full enjoyment of rights.	This program area focuses on enabling individuals and communities to demand their rights and services, hold duty bearers accountable and participate in public affairs.	This program area focuses on creating openness in decision making processes, delivery of goods and services and public access to all relevant information.	This program area focuses on strengthening the adherence to the rule of law and the monitoring and protection of human rights.
